- Guest Speaker Katrina Orsini Program Associate for Academic Engagement for the George Washington University Museum and The Textile Museum. (see below)



Katrina Orsini is a textile historian, educator, and sustainable fashion expert. She is currently the program associate for academic engagement at The George Washington University Museum and The Textile Museum. She has been with the museum since 2021, with a special focus on research and curriculum for the George Washington University and the wider academic community. She teaches the course *Sust 1005: Responsible Fashion* in GW's Sustainability Program and has published on sustainability pedagogy in museums. Orsini is the

curator of *Source Material: Lessons in Responsible Fashion*, an exhibition at The Textile Museum which focuses on the negative impacts of overproduction and overconsumption of the global fashion industry.

Orsini's talk will highlight how historical collection objects can inspire today's sewers and provide examples of contemporary designers who are reimagining and

resurrecting these historical practices today, using her current exhibition as the launching pad. The Textile Museum exhibition is the product of Orsini's research and course work with the GW students. Together they used the museum's historical collection to inspire thinking outside the box regarding the fashion industry's use of resources, appreciation for materials and labor, and respect for heritage textile traditions. Such concerns are scrutinized by those with an aspiration for more sustainable fashion system today, but promising solutions to fashion's contemporary problems can be found from a time before the word "sustainability" existed.

Previously, Orsini was a Smithsonian Fellow at the Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum in the Textile Department. She has also taught at the New York School of Interior Design and Parson School of Design at the New School. She holds a BFA from the University of Connecticut.
